Dear Chief Gibson:

Enclosed please find our proposed First Renewal and Amendment to Lease Agreement, which is essentially a counter-proposal sent in response to your August 10, 2015 proposed lease.

In this counter-proposal, we do express a willingness to reduce the annual lease amount, primarily in recognition of OVFR assuming the routine maintenance obligation, but also to recognize that OVFR has never charged for fire protection services under RCW 52.30.020, and by this agreement it agrees not to do so while OVFR continues to lease the Public Safety Building.

As you can see, the City of Orting is not interested in selling the building to any party at this particular time. Also, the City cannot justify to its taxpayers reducing the rent to a nominal sum at such time as the bonds are paid off, because the building will still be a valuable city asset at that time. Finally, while de-annexation of the city or withdrawal from the fire district is not planned or very likely to occur in the future, we have been advised by legal counsel that we do not have the legal authority to bind for all time any future city council members to a promise not to submit that question to the voters. We must always recognize that our citizens, voters and taxpayers are paramount and that the right to vote on such matters is vital to our form of government, so we are unable and unwilling to include such a provision in a legal document such as a lease.

We too would like to continue the joint use and would like to finalize the revised lease agreement before the end of the calendar year. Our legal counsel, Joseph F. Quinn, has been given the city's permission to act as negotiator, so feel free to have your attorney negotiator(s) contact him directly to see if we can meet that deadline.
