Dear Commissioners,

I am reaching out to you today to respectfully request the Commission make an amendment to rule <u>8B</u> – <u>PROMOTIONAL PROCESS</u>. In addition, I request that the commission consider making the recommended amendment in response to emergency or exigent circumstances.

Over the course of the last year, the Orting Police Department has been down one permanent supervisor position and has experienced an unusually high increase in the number of Officers who have temporarily been unable to work due to injury or medical circumstances. This reduction of staff has placed added stress upon all employees of the department and has made overall supervision much more challenging. In addition to focusing additional time and energy towards recruitment and retention, a request was made to the commission to establish an eligibility list for the purpose of filling our open supervisor position, and the commission promptly began a promotional examination.

On October 25, 2023, I was advised by the Civil Service Secretary that all eligible candidates who participated in the promotional process scored lower than the 70 percent threshold required by current commission rules for candidates to be invited to an oral board. If no action is taken, zero candidates will be eligible to complete the process, rendering the rest of the promotional exam superfluous. An inability to promote supervisory staff currently needed by the department will have a significant impact on operations.

In order to preserve the current promotional examination, I am respectfully requesting the Commission consider taking the following legislative action at the November 2, 2023 special meeting;

- 1. Hold a vote of all attending Commissioners to declare that an emergency situation exists<sup>1</sup>, and
- 2. In response to the emergency, make an amendment, by majority vote<sup>2</sup>, to modify civil service rule <u>8B PROMOTIONAL PROCESS</u> adding a new section following 8B.1.4 stating:

"8B.1.5 If <u>all</u> applicants participating in a promotional examination fail to meet the minimum passing score of a single testing phase (written or oral), that phase of the promotional examination will be considered anomalous, and all applicants will be exempt from the minimum scoring requirements established for that phase of the examination."

It is my belief that an emergency situation exists and should be declared by the Commission in order to adopt the recommended amendment at the November 2, 2023 special meeting because, based on time constraints outlined in civil service rule 8B.1.3, waiting until the next regular scheduled meeting of the Civil Service Commission on November 27<sup>th</sup>, 2023 would exceed the four-week limit imposed, and thus invalidate the promotional examination.<sup>3</sup>

AMENDMENTS - The Commission may amend these rules or adopt new rules by majority vote of the Commission at any regular or special meeting of the Commission. <u>Unless, upon emergency declared by all Commissioners present</u>, amendment of these rules shall be first discussed in an open regular or special meeting prior to adoption. <u>Upon declaration of emergency</u>, a rule amendment may be adopted at the meeting at which the amendment is first proposed.

<sup>2</sup> RULE 14. AMENDMENTS - The Commission may amend these rules or adopt new rules by majority vote of the Commission at any regular or special meeting of the Commission. Unless, upon emergency declared by all Commissioners present, amendment of these rules shall be first discussed in an open regular or special meeting prior to adoption. Upon declaration of emergency, a rule amendment may be adopted at the meeting at which the amendment is first proposed.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> 8B.1.3. - The oral examination shall be set no sooner than two weeks but <u>no later than four weeks from receipt</u> of the test scores from the written testing agency. Notice of the oral examination shall be provided to all applicants at least five (5) days in advance of the oral examination.
